ODU Expands Safety Resources for Monarch Community

ODU has enhanced its safety services for the new school year, providing students, families, faculty and staff and the broader community with a range of tools designed to promote safety and well-being on- and off-campus.

The University is expanding its reach with ODU Alerts, which notifies the campus community — including ODU's Eastern Virginia Medical School campus and other auxiliary campuses. Visitors, ODU families and community members and vendors and contractors conducting work on ODU's campuses will be able to sign up to receive alerts in case of campus emergencies. Students are automatically enrolled for ODU Alerts and others can find information on how to sign up on the University's website. *ODU Safe* is replacing the LiveSafe mobile app, offering new features and resources to benefit the University community.

ODU Safe, available for free through the Apple Appstore and Google Play, can be accessed by students, faculty and staff using their MIDAS logins. Guest logins are available for members of the broader community.

ODU and the City of Norfolk, in concert with industry partners, celebrated the beginning of a new era in uncrewed maritime systems with the ribbon cutting of the Maritime Autonomous Systems Test Site (MASTS)

at Willoughby Boat Ramp in Norfolk [August 20th].




The test site is the result of several years of work between the City of Norfolk, the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development and ODU leadership to secure funding for the development of unmanned surface and underwater vehicles and make the city a hub of technology. The test site will provide hands-on experience for students and researchers to accelerate the development of maritime autonomy technologies.

Admiral Samuel Paparo, the 27th commander of the U.S. Indo-Pacific Command, will deliver a Waldo Family Lecture Series address titled "Joint Force Strategy in the Indo-Pacific: Peace Through Strength."

USINDOPACOM, the nation's oldest and largest combatant command, includes 380,000 service men and women and Department of Defense civilians and is responsible for all U.S. military activities in the Indo-Pacific, covering 36 nations, 14 time zones, and 60 percent of the world's population.

Old Dominion University's first endowed lecture series, the Waldo Family Lecture Series on International Relations, was established in 1985. Personal ties to the university and to the Hampton Roads community led the Waldo family to select Old Dominion as the home of their lecture series. Because of the area's significant military presence and proximity to an international port, the family chose international relations as the lecture series' theme.

Over the years, renowned speakers in the fields of government, foreign affairs, journalism, education, and public service have visited the campus and met with students and faculty. Support for the free lecture series comes from the Waldo family, friends, and the business community.




the program's fleet. This makes Old Dominion unique, as very few schools have


