

Barry Art Museum Receives Nearly 200 Glass Works

The Barry Art Museum at ODU will expand its studio glass collection through the promised gift of nearly 200 pieces of modern and contemporary glass from Drs. Myra and Harold Weiss. The collection features



international glass sculptures, including many by Czech artists Stanislav Libenský and Jaroslava Brychtová, along with studio glass pieces by American artists, such as Karen LaMonte.

When the Barry Art Museum renovation is complete (est. early 2027), a selection of the Weiss collection will be on display in one of the museum's expanded and reconfigured galleries. The combined Barry, Waitzer, and Weiss collections will form one of the largest concentrations of modern and contemporary art glass anywhere, drawing visitors from around the United

States and the world.



Guest Speaker: Mia Laufer, Ph.D.

Hampton Roads Jewish Artists of the Past in Context

Join Mia Laufer, Ph.D., Irene Leache Curator of European Art at the Chrysler Museum of Art for a sneak peek at the exhibition Legacy 2025: Jewish Artists of the Past. Drawing on the four main themes of the exhibition—Torah, Jewish Culture, Contemporary Aesthetics, and Personal Expression—Laufer will discuss the work in the exhibition and place it into the context of art practice in late 20th century American art.

Before joining the Chrysler Museum of Art in January 2025, Mia Laufer, Ph.D. held curatorial positions at the Des Moines Art Center and the Minnesota Museum of American Art. Laufer holds a BA in Art History from New York University and an MA and Ph.D. in Art History and Archaeology from Washington University in St. Louis. Her research often explores the relationship between modern art and Jewish identity.
